

WELLHEAD PROTECTION PROGRAM

The Wellhead Protection Program is a mandatory program that all public water systems are required to participate in through the MN department of Health. Each public water system works with a Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) or Minnesota Rural Water Association (MRWA) source water planner to develop a Wellhead Protection Plan and implement wellhead protection measures as specified in Minnesota Rules, Chapter 4720.

The MDH was granted authority in 1989 with the passing of the Minnesota Groundwater Protection Act, which was a response to the 1986 amendment to the Federal Safe Drinking Water Act. The rules governing wellhead protection were adopted in November 1997.

Wellhead protection is an approach to prevent human-caused contaminants from entering wells used by public water systems. To be considered a public water system well by the MDH the well would provide drinking water to 15 or more connections or to an average of 25 or more people per day for at least 60 days per year.

Wellhead protection plan development includes identifying the source of the drinking water, establishing a protection area known as a Drinking Water Supply Management Area (DWSMA); identifying the DWSMA vulnerability and potential contaminant sources; and identifying strategies to protect their source of drinking water. Once a wellhead protection plan is approved by the MN Department of Health it is active for 10 years. The public water suppliers are required to implement measures listed in their Wellhead protection plan which can include constructing a back up well, backup power, above and below ground tank removal, education and many other ways to protect the public water supplies source water.

FEDERAL FLOOD INSURANCE NOW AVAILABLE IN THE CITY OF UPSALA, MINNESOTA

Washington, D.C. -The City of Upsala has joined over 22,000 communities nationwide that are

allowed to purchase federally backed flood insurance. This availability follows the community's

adoption and enforcement of ordinances to reduce flood losses and acceptance by the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).

The City of Upsala is now a participant in the NFIP effective on July 31, 2024. Residents of the City of Upsala will be able to purchase flood insurance up to

the limits under the Regular Phase of the program. However, there is a 30-day waiting period before flood insurance coverage goes

into effect. For single-family dwellings, the building coverage limit is \$250,000, and the contents

coverage limit is \$100,000. Renters can also protect their belongings by purchasing contents

coverage. For commercial properties, the building and contents coverage limits are both \$500,000.

Lenders must require borrowers whose properties are located in a designated flood hazard

area to purchase flood insurance as a condition of receiving a federally backed mortgage loan in

accordance with the Federal Disaster Protection Act of 1973.

The NFIP is implemented through the Federal Emergency Management Agency. There are

over 5 million flood insurance policies in more than 22,000 participating communities nationwide.



PREPARE YOUR HOME FOR WINTER

The City of Upsala works hard to clean up streets after the snow falls. Please keep your sidewalks and driveways plowed and de-iced!

Help the City of Upsala and MnDot by staying off Main Street after a considerable snowfall until it is cleaned-off and safe. There is no parking on Main Street and side streets during snow removal. **No**

4-wheelers or snowmobiles in the City Park.

Help your home during cold weather:

- Make sure you have heat tapes on your water lines
- Get your furnace or chimney serviced
- Reverse your ceiling fans (clockwise in winter)
- Prevent ice dams
- Caulk window and doors and put plastic on windows
- · Divert water when ice and snow thaws
- Turn off exterior faucets
- Winterize your sump pump
- Change your batteries on your smoke detector and carbon monoxide alarm
- Use curtains or blinds to keep out drafts
